Course Code: PEN-OO1 Course Title: Gender Studies Credit: 04 Semester: II Programme: MA/M.Sc./MSW in any Program other than English.

Objectives: This course aims to train the students in a multi-genre approach to Gender writings by introducing them to different theories of gender, be it feminism, queer studies or masculinity studies. Students will prioritize issues of gender through representative texts and develop gender aesthetic.
