- i) The title of the article should be bold, centred and typed in a 14 point Times New Roman Font.
- ii) The author(s) details i.e. full name, designation, name of the organization, city, pin, state country, e-mail ID, contact details i.e. mobile/landline phone numbers, in 11 point Times New Roman should be centered below the title.
- iii) All manuscripts must be accompanied by a brief abstract. Abstract including key words must not exceed 350 words. It should highlight research background, methodology, major finding(s) and conclusion in brief.
- iv) Manuscript must not be more than 3500 words. It should be single spaced, Times New Roman font 12 point with 1-inch margin on all four sides.
- v) The authors should list all the references alphabetically at end of the paper (APA 7th Edition).



ABOUT THE THEME

Many of such dominant narratives often endorse State perspective over the people and such body of knowledge views the region from security-frontier and security-led development perspective. In the narratives of the colonial state, the communities of the region often appear only as members of discrete communities with some exclusive cultural traits. Such kind of exclusivist representations of people continued in the post-colonial state. However, in the recent years, many scholarly works on Northeast India have focused on the 'voice' and 'representation' of people in the region. There is growing concerns being raised about eschewing colonial modes of inquiry and examining the intersections of class, community, caste, race, gender, sexuality and nationality in ways that can address issues of power and inequality at multiple levels.
